












Civil War Tails "Battlefield Fun" Scavenger Hunt

Each corps in the Union Army of the Potomac had a different badge. The soldiers took great pride in this symbol of their corps, so they often put the particular corps badge shape on their regiment's monument. As you look at monuments on the battlefield, how many corps badges can you find?

- First (I) Corps – Disc or Circle 
- Second (II) Corps – Trefoil 
- Third (III) Corps – Diamond 
- Fifth (V) Corps – Maltese Cross 
- Sixth (VI) Corps – Greek Cross 
- Eleventh (XI) Corps – Crescent 
- Twelfth (XII) Corps – Star 

On the battlefield, you will see many cannons. But did you know you can tell which type is which? Can you find all the different types?

- Napoleon smoothbore gun – the barrel is bronze (a golden-brown color), and being out in the weather turns it green! Note the flared end of the muzzle, too. 
- 3-inch Ordnance rifled gun – the barrel is iron, so it's black. 
- Parrott rifled gun – the barrel is also iron, so it's black, but it has a reinforcing band around the breech. 
- Challenge:
The Confederates had two Whitworth breech-loading rifled guns from England! You can see a Whitworth near the Eternal Light Peace Memorial. Can you find it?

- Climbed an observation tower (the castle-like New York monument on Little Round Top and the Pennsylvania Memorial count ☺)
- Seen Gen. George Meade's Headquarters (Union Army)
